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## This Week in school ...

This week, Year 4 have been reading and identifying different types of texts which all had a sporting theme! We read our final screen on our E book 'Incredible Sports' which was all about Mountain Unicycling and was titled One 'Wheelie' Weird Sport! We have also been making sure that we read questions in maths carefully, making sure that we fully answer the questions that we have been asked!

Year 3 have continued to look at non-fiction books about the Romans. They have identified key features of a non-fiction text and used these to locate information. We have continued our class reader Tony Robinson's 'Weird world of wonders - Romans'.

In **Reception** we have been reading 'The Everywhere Bear' by Julia Donaldson. The children have designed and made their own sandwiches for a Teddy Bears picnic. The children then had to write a list of simple instructions on how to make a sandwich.

This week the **Nursery** children have been sharing the story about 'Old Bear' by Jane Hissy. They have listened to a selection of Old Bear stories and chosen their favourite character

Year 5 have used their non-fiction reading about migration to create some fabulous non-chronological reports. They included lots of technical vocabulary and fascinating facts to inform the reader about their chosen animals.

Year 6 have now been completely lost to the world of Hogwarts and would happily listen to the book for their entire English lesson. We have been dragging ourselves away from the text in order to revise noun phrases, modal verbs and

relative clauses this week – but all with a Harry Potter theme to them.
