

### This Week in school ...

Year 3 - This week we have continued to share our class reader 'The Sheep-Pig' by Dick King-Smith. We have also shared lots of shape poems from 'Doodle Dandies: Poems That Take Shape' by Lewis, J. Patrick.



This week, <u>Reception</u> have finished their animals around the world topic by looking at birds as we thought it tied in very nicely with eggs and Easter! The children have listened to the story Owl Babies by Martin Waddell, they have learnt about different birds and now know that not all birds can fly. We have also read The Easter Story and discussed why this is important to Christians and how they might celebrate.

The <u>Nursery</u> children have shared 'The Easter Story' this week and shared the Christian belief of Easter. We have also shared other Easter stories. It has been lovely to see children independently sharing books with one another in our ECAT / Talk for Writing area and story corner.

After writing their own poems this week <u>Year 2</u> have been performing their Monster poems to the class. They all did an excellent job!

This week, <u>Year 1</u> have been learning about the Easter Story and why we celebrate Easter. The children were very knowledgeable and were able to recall what happened on each day leading up to Easter Sunday. We now know why we have an egg to celebrate.

This week in <u>Year 4</u> we have been reading the Easter Story and examining how the main characters felt on the different days of Holy Week. We have also been sharing our Ancient Greek projects which were full of fascinating facts and other information. We had instructions on how to make items such as temples and shields and how to dress as an Ancient Greek!

<u>Year 5</u> completed their poetry work based on T.S.Elliot's OLD DEUTERONOMY. They created their own animal poems using the same rhyming pattern and style as the original. After a lot of very hard work on revision for their SATS, Year 6 are ready for a

well-earned rest. They continue to impress me with their mature choice of reading books and their enthusiasm for improving their reading skills. Many of them are using the eBook library to loan books, which is available via the school website.
